**824** young people came to Mission Arlington over Spring Break. They came from **9** different states and **14** Texas cities. They led back yard Bible clubs in **93** locations. **9,399** different children and youth attended. **282** people accepted Christ as their Savior. We thank God for your support.

## MISSION ARLINGTON'S EASTER STORE



**474** families (**1,709** people) came to Mission Arlington's two-day Easter Store. They received specially filled Easter baskets and new clothing for the Spring. They also heard the Easter Story. **89** people accepted Christ. **152** altogether made spiritual decisions.
