For the sixth year in a row, Mission Arlington/Mission Metroplex has received Charity Navigator’s highest honor, a **four-star rating**.

According to Ken Berger, Charity Navigator’s President and CEO, in a letter to Tillie Burgin,

only 3 percent of the charities we rate have received at least 6 consecutive 4-star evaluations, indicating that Mission Arlington/Mission Metroplex outperforms most other charities in America.

This ‘exceptional’ designation from Charity Navigator differentiates Mission Arlington/Mission Metroplex from its peers and demonstrates to the public it is worthy of their trust.

Berger congratulates the Mission for its commitment to “sound fiscal management” and to “accountability and transparency.”

According to Berger, Mission Arlington/Mission Metroplex “consistently adheres to good governance and other best practices that **minimize the chance of unethical activities** and consistently **executes its mission in a fiscally responsible way.**”

The Mission Arlington/Mission Metroplex family is grateful for this commendation, and for the opportunity to be a part of the “4-Star” Charity Navigator family once again.



According to our annual audit, completed this Spring, our **administrative overhead** for 2011 was only **2.2 PERCENT**.

This means that almost **98 cents out of every**

dollar you give ends up in ministry to real people in need and not in administrative costs.
