"Rainbow Express" is Mission Arlington/ Mission Metroplex's version of a back yard Bible club. Bible stories, Scripture songs, Scripture memorization, crafts, activities, and games all come together to form what we call *Rainbow Express*.

Since March, **40 different groups** (833 people) have come from **9 different states** to help out. 4,444 children in 97 different locations attended at least one event. Total attendance reached nearly **10,000 children** (9,640), and 278 children and teenagers accepted Christ.

3,000 children attended our Easter egg hunt. You provided 60,000 eggs.

1,300 people came to our Easter store. Throughout the Easter week we were able to tell the Easter story to more than 3,000 people.

39 people made decisions for Christ, and 22 people were baptized on Easter Sunday.



Mission Arlington/Mission Metroplex takes students to and from school five days a week throughout the school year.

The students that ride the bus live too close to the school to be picked up by the Arlington Independent School District, but still have to cross dangerous intersections in order to arrive safely in the classroom.

Randy Lawrence drives one of the these buses, and he tells us that he is having the "time of his life." Randy drives children from several apartments on Peach Street across Collins to get to Webb and Speer elementary schools. It takes two runs each morning, and two in the afternoon, to deliver the more than 150 children who ride the bus each day.

The children can't wait to see "Mr. Randy," and get their daily hug and a word of encouragement. In fact, Randy is much more than a bus driver to these children and their families. Randy has become their minister. He spends time listening to the children, and he makes time to play a supporting role in their lives, both in school and at home.

Randy has been with Mission Arlington/Mission Metroplex for nearly three years now. Like all of the *Mission* staff, Randy works at least 2 jobs. In addition to driving the bus, Randy keeps all of the *Mission* vehicles running. He also pastors the growing English speaking congregation which meets on Peach Street.

We are grateful to God for Randy and for each of you who make his work possible.
