Lesson Goal: To help students to understand the Christian's new life with Christ. **Scripture:** Ephesians 2:4-8; Psalm 84:11; II Timothy 1:9;

Our Scripture lesson tells us that we are made alive with Christ. This means that as Christ is alive, so is every Christian. We need to look back at what the aliveness of Jesus means.

We remember that He was born to Mary in the normal way humans are born and that He lived his life just like any other human. He was not super-human. He got hungry, felt pain, laughed, cried, experienced loneliness, got tired, and knew all other human experiences. He was tempted to sin, just like we are. <u>He was human.</u> <u>Some think that the fact that He was also God meant that He didn't have to deal with life like we do. However, the Bible says otherwise</u>.*

So, we have a person who lived with all the difficulties, limitations and temptations that we do. He was arrested and crucified. And, as we said in the last lesson, He really died. He died just like all humans die. But, He came back to life. And that new life is the kind of life that every Christian will ultimately have. <u>Now, His</u> body is eternal. His life extends beyond this world and time. He is more heavenly than earthly.

Every believer will be raised up to live with God in Heaven, just as Jesus was raised up. And it is already a done deal. Our life with God and Jesus in Heaven is more than a promise, it was finished when Jesus rose from the dead and ascended into Heaven.

Let's say that you were moving to a new city. You needed a place to live. A friend of yours who loved you and wanted you to be cared for decided to help. That friend sent a car to get you. Your transportation to the new city was cared for. That friend bought a new house for you to live in and furnished it with the best furniture available. Your home in the new city was cared for. It wasn't something that this friend promised and then worked on providing when you got ready to move, it was already a done deal.

That's the way it is with our future. God provided a way for us to be in His presence forever. He sent Jesus to make that possible. Jesus came to earth, lived a perfect life showing us how to live, then went to Heaven and is there, preparing a place for us. (John 14:1-4) It's a done deal.

All this was done, according to Ephesians 2:7, so that God could show us and all the world that He loves us

and to show us how kind He is. His generosity, His grace, is just that amazing. The Apostle Paul says it so very well, "For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this not from yourselves, it is the gift of God." (Ephesians 2:8)

How are we made alive? What does this new life mean? The second chapter of Ephesians tells us clearly. <u>We are made alive by the power of God and this new life is with Christ</u>. Right now, while we are alive, we have a preview of Heaven: We understand and experience the love of God. We know the peace of God that we discussed in an earlier lesson. We know the security of God because we understand His promise of eternal life. When we die, life doesn't end, we just move on to a new place with a new body. Everything about us that is perishable will have disappeared. Everything about us will be perfect. (I Corinthians 15:51-54)

There is an old hymn that says it very well, "He breaks the power of cancelled sin, He sets the prisoner free."

When we are made alive by Jesus, we are truly free. We are free from the power of sin that keeps us from experiencing the love of God. We are free to live our lives without fear, because we know God is in control. We are free from the threat of eternal death, which is the payment for sin. We are free from worries about the future, because we know that God has prepared a place...a fabulous place, Heaven...for us when we die.

Alive! With Christ...talk about getting a life, this is the best.
