<ol> <li>Understand that Habakkuk called out to God for help.</li> <li>Recognize that God was punishing His people, Israel.</li> </ol>	God told Habakkuk that He was punishing His people, Israel. He under- stood that it was God's judgment against them. But Habakkuk wanted to know the reason God had not stopped the Chaldeans who were evil people.					
3. Learn that God planned to punish the Chaldeans who were evil people.	Sometimes it seems that people who are doing wrong get away with it. It does not seem fair. It does not seem right. Habakkuk told God, "Your eyes are too pure to look at what is evil. You can't put up with the wrong things people do. So why do you put up with those who can't be trusted?" (Habakkuk 1:13 NIrV)					
4. Understand that Habakkuk put his hope in the Lord.	What do you think God said? God told Habakkuk that He would take care of their sin in His time. He knew that the Chaldean people were doing wrong and He was going to punish them for it. In fact, He even tells Habakkuk what is going to happen. The Chaldean people will be destroyed! (Habakkuk 2)					

1. Habakkuk talked to God about the terrible things that were happening.

2. Habakkuk understood that God was punishing His people, Israel.

3. God planned to punish the Chaldeans who were sinful people.

4. Habakkuk said he would put his hope in God.

In Chapter 3 we find out that Habakkuk was afraid of what would happen. It said in verse 16 that his heart was pounding and his lips were quivering (trembling). But Habakkuk decided to put his hope and trust in God.

Sometimes it seems that God is far away. It may seem that He is not listening to us. But we can always hope in the Lord. Habakkuk said, "The fig trees might not bud. The vines might not produce any grapes. The olive crop might fail. The fields might not produce any food. There might not be any sheep in the pens. There might not be any cattle in the barns. But I will still be glad because of what the Lord has done. God my Savior fills me with joy. The Lord and King gives me strength. He makes my feet like the feet of a deer. He helps me walk on the highest places." (Habakkuk 3:17-19 NIrV)

The Bible says that "those who are right with God live by faith." (Habakkuk 2:4; Romans 1:18 NIrV) Habakkuk knew that God would help him and take care of him. He trusted God and was sure that He would keep him safe. He put his hope in God. We can put our trust in God, too. God sent Jesus to provide a way for us to know God and be with Him forever.

### Application

## **Preschool Lesson**

## Read the Bible

## READ: Habakkuk 3:17-19 (Hold your Bible open throughout the story.)

**Teachers:** Bring figs and grapes for a snack. Allow the children to color pictures of figs and grapes.

## **Learning Activities**

•Memory verse activity — Bring a grocery bag with plastic olive branches, figs, grapes, cows and sheep. Write words from the memory verse on name tags. Attach to the plastic items. Have the kids practice putting the verse in order. Create a set of the memory verse words on name tags for each child to take home.

•**Test your memory** — Cut out circles to represent grapes. Write key phrases on them. Create a cluster of grapes from the circles as you tell the story.

•Taste activity – Bring figs and grapes for a snack.

•Think about it — Habakkuk did not understand the reason God was allowing their Enemies, the Chaldeans, to mistreat them. Their enemies were sinful. Talk about how we all have sinned.

•God told Habakkuk that He planned to punish the Chaldeans who were a sinful people. Talk about how sin has consequences.

Habakkuk put his hope in God. Talk about how we can put our hope in God.

•Touch activity — Allow the children to color pictures of olive branches, figs, grapes, cattle, and sheep.

Make sheep using construction paper and cotton balls. See the internet for ideas.

Make cows using paper plates. See the internet for ideas.

Make deer using construction paper. See the internet for ideas.

•Run and play — Play charades. Each child pretends to be an animal and the others must guess what animal.

Play Pictionary. Give the children cards that you create of items in the story (olive branches, figs, grapes, cattle, sheep, etc.) divide the children into groups. Each group will have two teams. One child from one team draws and his team guesses what is being drawn. Then the other team takes their turn.


•Listen — As the children take time for silence, remind them that God wants us to put our hope in Him.

•Sing – Sing "Solid Rock," "My Life is in You Lord," or another song related to the story.

•Reach out — During class, pray (by name) for kids who did not come today. Ask the children to go with you to deliver the memory verse activity set to those who were absent. Pray with the children who were absent. Encourage them to read the story in the Bible.


