The information below is to help you in teaching the lesson. DO NOT read this page to the students. Instead, teach the information in your own words. Be sure to finish the student's lesson as well. The Scripture references in parentheses are for additional study, to round out the information given in the lesson. Become familiar with these passages as well, to provide additional Scriptures to your students.

Lesson 27 – Our Standard for Belief and Life (Teacher's Lesson)

Opening: Answer the opening question.

Study Notes:

Joshua 1:7-8

Verse 7 – What was required for success? Obeying the Law.

God's definition for "success" is not riches, power, or position, but obedience to His Word.

How much of the Law did God exhort Joshua to obey? All of it.

We cannot choose to obey only those parts of the Bible that are easy – we must know and put into practice all of God's Word.

Verse 8 – What are the three things that God told Joshua to do with respect to His Word? Recite it, meditate on it, do it.

Scripture should permeate every area of our lives. We should memorize it so that what goes into our minds comes out through words and actions.

Psalm 119:137

All of God's laws are right because God's character is just. God is never wrong and He always wants the best for us.

Luke 21:33

The Word of God will never pass away. Because God is eternal, we can trust that His Word will always be with us. He will protect the Scriptures because it is His letter to humanity.

John 17:17

Because God does not and cannot lie (Hebrews 6:18), we can trust that His Word will always be the truth. Man's interpretation can twist the meaning (2 Timothy 3:16), but His Word is still the truth.

1 Timothy 4:16

Our beliefs must be carefully tested against the Word of God. Any that clash should be brought into agreement with the truth of Scripture. Our beliefs and our actions must also be in perfect agreement. With this we show that we are servants of Christ, and living holy lives, other will be influenced and will imitate us (1 Pedro 2:12).

Summary: The Bible is the source of our knowledge about God's standard of belief and behavior.

Application:

The purpose of this checklist is not to make people feel guilt, but to explain that the standard of God is perfection and that in His grace God accepts us as we are. Explain that the purpose of the Law was never to take away sin, but to make us aware of sin, thus allowing repentance (look at Romans 3:19-20).
