Another thing is that I would be walking to school everyday, but thanks to you I have a ride to and from school. And, not only that, but I can get on the bus without getting talked about or mistreated. Thank you Miss Emily.

But here is the serious part that I want to thank you for, Miss Emily. As I grew up, living with my granny, we would always have to go to church. I didn't understand what the preacher was talking about then. But as I grew up, and we moved to these apartments, I began coming to church in our club house.

That's when I heard you talking about being saved. I went home and thought about it that day and asked Jesus into my heart. Miss Emily, no matter how many churches I go to yours will be the one that I will always remember, because that is where I got saved."
