
Jesus Lo Prepare your Heart for Christmas

Did you know there is more than one name for Jesus? There are even more than the 25 included here! Maybe you are wondering what He needs all those names for. Well, he doesn't necessarily need all those names as much as we need them to understand just how great our God is! Each of his names describes a bit of his character. They tell us what Jesus is like. This Christmas season, spend some time focusing on each name as you cut a "strip of hay" each day to place in Jesus' manger and thank Him for each of His characteristics.

What you'll need:


scissors crayons, markers, or colored pencils glue or tape copies of pages 2-4 construction paper to cover the box.

What you'll do:

- 1. Prepare the "manger" by cutting the top off of a tissue box. Cover the box with construction paper. Set aside.
- 2. Provide 1 copy of baby Jesus (page 2) and encourage your students to color it as they wish.
- 3. Provide a copy of pages 3 and 4 to each student. Consider printing them on yellow or light brown colored paper. If you print the memory verses on white paper, encourage your students to color those pages as well. This will be the "hay" for your tissue box manger.
- 4. Leaving the header of pages 3 and 4, cut off the left, bottom, and right edges. Glue or tape the header of page 4 behind page 3, leaving no space between memory verse strips. Paper clip baby Jesus to the top of the memory verse list. Send each student's memory verse list and tissue box manger home with them, explaining to them the following.

How they'll use this:

- 1. Encourage students to hang their memory verse list in their home and find a prominent place for the manger.
- 2. December 1, the first (from the bottom) memory verse strip will be cut off, read and talked about, and placed in the manger. This will continue each day in December leading up to Christmas. On Christmas Day, read the baby Jesus verse and place Him on top of the hay in the manger. Consider singing "Away in a Manger."
