From this island, Barnabas and Paul sailed to the town of Perga. From there they traveled to another town with the name Antioch. (This was a different Antioch.).

On the church day, Paul and Barnabas went to the temple church. After the teaching, a note was sent asking if Paul or Barnabas would share a message with everyone.

Paul stood up and reminded all the people about all the things God had done in their history. Then, he shared how God sent Jesus to make a way for us to get to Heaven.

As Paul and Barnabas were leaving the church, many people invited them to come back and share more about Jesus. So, the next church day, Paul and Barnabas went back to the church. This time the place was packed! Almost the whole city was there to hear about Jesus!

Learning Activities	Help the kids see how Paul and Barnabas told people about Jesus wherever they went.
Memory Verse Activities	Trace each person's footprint (with or without shoes) and write the verse on it. Talk about how Paul traveled with friends to tell people about Jesus. Share how he prayed to God and asked for the people to believe in Jesus.
Prayer Time	Paul and Barnabas had to really listen to God to know when to move to another city, and know what to say when people asked them questions. Pray and ask God to help us really LISTEN to Him and do or go exactly where He sends us.
Clean Up/Snack time	Make some trail mix as a snack to remember how Paul and Barnabas traveled city to city.

Preschool Lesson For Paul Travels

Hands-On Activities For Paul in Antioch

Create a backpack out of a plastic sack with handles. The handles are the straps for their arms. (Remember to always be careful with plastic sacks and small children. Be sure they do not put their face in the bags.)

Have a fun Treasure hunt for the kids. Write out clues and let them travel around from place to place like Paul and Barnabas did.

Invite the kids to go visiting with you this week. Share how you visit people and tell them about Jesus just as Paul and Barnabas did.
