Bible Story

The following is a summary of the Bible story to help you with your preparation.

## Hands-On Activities For Lydia believes

Use markers to dye cloth purple. Or use the markers and draw crosses on a piece of cloth.

Practice weaving with purple construction paper or crochet using purple yarn. There is an easy way to crochet a chain stitch using your hands. If you are unfamiliar, ask one of the children. Most likely, one will know how to do it. There is a page attached to help you learn.

For smaller kids, show them that red and blue make purple. You can use play dough or even food coloring in two glasses of water. Be careful that it doesn't spill.

Make the Lydia puppet and act out the story.

Most of our lessons in Acts help children to understand what it means to believe in Jesus and help them see the importance of telling others about Him. This lesson is another opportunity to help them see what it means to truly BELIEVE in Jesus and how just knowing about God is not enough. It also helps kids that are Christians to see the need to help others come to believe in Him. Be sensitive to the Spirit as you share with your kids. Be observant and see what God does through you.
