King Xerxes Has a Party!

After only three years as king, King Xerxes is ruler over all of Persia . . . and Persia is pretty big!

There are 127 territories in all and they reach all the way from India to Cush! King Xerxes lives in the Persian capital of Susa.

About that party, it was as big as the kingdom and it was only for the really important people. All of the princes, nobles, officials, and military leaders of Persia and Media were invited. "Every day for 180 days [King Xerxes] showed his guests the great wealth of his kingdom. He also showed them how glorious his kingdom was." (Esther 1:4 NIrV) The likes of it has never

been seen before: six months of partying, with something new and glorious to see every day!

PARTY IN SUSA!

And that's not all! When the 180 days for the nobles was over, the king gave another party! That's right—another party! This party lasted for only seven days, but it was for everyone who lived in the fortress city of Susa. "Everyone from the least important person to the most important person to the most important person was invited." (Esther 1:5 NIrV)

The party was in the king's very own garden. There were blue and white banners everywhere that hung from white and purple ropes connected to amazing marble pillars by silver rings. There were gold and silver couches on a mosaic floor. The floor

was stunning. It "was made out of small stones. The floor had purple crystal, marble, mother-of-pearl, and other stones of great value." (Esther 1:6 NIrV)

This king has spared no expense. His own royal wine was served in gold cups, each different from the next. And the king's servants were instructed to give the king's guests whatever they asked for.

It was quite a party!

THE PERSIAN EMPIRE

Now that you have heard about the amazing parties King Xerxes gave, you might want to know a little more about his kingdom.

King Xerxes reigned over the 127-province Persian Empire. During this time, the Persian empire extended as far west as Macedonia and as far east as the Indus River; it stretched north from the Caucasus Mountains and south to the Aral Sea to the Red Sea and the Persian Gulf.

Their government, developed by Xerxes' father Darius, became a model for many governments after them.

The Persians invented

the game of polo. They made beautiful pottery and mosaics. Their art

was visibly influenced by Greek and Egyptian art.


HANDS-ON ACTIVITIES
