Four YEARS I S LONG TIME

Have you ever noticed that the second chapter of Esther (NASB) begins with, "After these things . . . "?

"After what things?," you might ask. That is a very good question. What do you remember from chapter one? King Xerxes throws two parties and deposes a queen. But that was in the third year of his reign (483 BC) as king. Queen Esther wasn't chosen until King Xerxes

seventh year (479 BC) as king.

"History books tell us that during that time, this particular king made an ambitious but disastrous attempt to conquer Greece. So 'after these things' means that these events took place after he had led an expedition against Greece and returned home to Susa in defeat. . . You see. [King Xerxes] is not drunk any longer.

He's thinking clearly now. And his own needs are intensified by his loneliness."1 The outcome . . . the search for a new queen.

FROM THE EDITOR

You know, beauty is a nice thing, but is that all there is to life? It seems like it sometimes with all the make-up and gels and beauty treatments available for women as well as men. Our memory verse says, "Charm can fool you. Beauty fades. But a woman who has respect for the Lord should be praised." (Proverbs 31:30 NIrV) Respect for the Lord isn't

just a girl thing! Psalm 33:8 (NIrV) says, "Let the whole earth have respect for the Lord. Let all of the people in the world honor him."

What does it mean to have respect for God? "To have respect for the Lord is to hate evil." (Proverbs 8:13 NIrV) Being a friend with the things the world says is okay makes you an enemy of the God who created you and shows that you

hate God and what He stands for. (James 4:4) "Do not long for what sinners have. But always show great respect for the Lord." (Proverbs 23:17 NIrV) There is a promise for those who respect God, "Having respect for the Lord leads to a longer life." (Proverbs 10:27 NIrV) Don't you want that to be you? It starts with a relationship with God ... Let me tell you how today.

BEHIND SCENES THE

Something is going on behind the scenes that hasn't been spoken. You see, Esther, and her uncle Mordecai, are Jews. They are living in Persia because Mordecai's great, great grandfather was taken away from Jerusalem by the Babylonian king, Nebuchadnezzar,

around 600 BC. The Babylonian Empire ended when Persia invaded! Esther's family decided to stay in Persia rather than return to Jerusalem. As Esther was being taken to the palace for the beauty contest, her uncle asked her to keep their nationality a secret.

Esther agreed and is a woman of her word. But why should it be a problem if a Jewish girl is chosen queen? We will see in the weeks

ahead!

Memory Verse Activities for Proverbs 31:30

Make mirrors with cardstock and aluminum foil. Print the memory verse on the back of the mirror.

Provide coloring sheets that include the memory verse.

SOMETHING TO THINK ABOUT

For older students: Divide your girls and guys if possible. For the girls: Talk about what kind of girl they are trying to be. Is all of their focus on outward appearances? Look at 1 Samuel 16: 7. For the guys: Talk about what kind of girl they are looking for. Are they only looking for someone who is beautiful on the outside? Discuss Proverbs 31:10-31.

Talk about the timing from Babylonian captivity to Persian Rule.

Proverbs 14:8

HANDS-ON ACTIVITIES

Make perfume using rubbing alcohol and things like cinnamon sticks and orange peel. Several days are needed for best results.

Make an enormous timeline from Babylonian captivity to Persian reign. Use butcher paper on a wall in your classroom space.

Make cupcakes with "jeweled" sugar crystal topping.

Have a "beauty day" with your girls. Paint nails, fix hair, and talk about the importance of loving God by obeying. Send them home with beauty bags that include the memory verse.
